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EASTERTIDE GREETINGS!

Our staff and volunteers have been working hard to get our lower level and kitchen set up for major renovations. Seeing their diligence has added to my excitement as we look towards the latter part of this year when we can enjoy a transfigured campus!

Any building project in our homes, businesses, and certainly in our churches calls for some patience. Indeed, we will have many moments over the spring and summer when we'll ask for some pardon for our dust. Our faithful staff and volunteer groups are working hard to ensure that we can continue to offer our best to honor God and edify His people while we await the completion of work in the building. Still, we know that we'll all need quite a bit of flexibility as so much of the next few months will be dictated by needs on the ground, oftentimes dictated by contractors, vendors, and other voices beyond our parish community.

As in all things in the life of a parish, our project offers an opportunity for us to grow in our spirituality and discipleship. Our circumstance here demands a large measure of patience, but I am not the most patient person. In my impatience, I'm much more inclined to haphazardly move along the pace of the project to meet my timetable (and thus risk the quality of the work). In my impatience, I'm more likely to be abrupt or discourteous to the people who are in my way (and thus risk the quality of our communion together). In my impatience, I'll probably grumble or complain about all the little things that bother me about the project (and thus risk my gratitude for God's provision). What I need is a great gift of patience beyond my meager supply. This coming season of building, in addition to all of God's great gifts for the benefit of our parish ministry, I am definitely asking that I be granted a greater measure of patience and forbearance.

While in prison, Paul wrote to the Ephesians, "I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all lowliness and meekness, with patience, forbearing one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace." This is the kind of text I have in mind when a need for grace comes around. I pray that in the season ahead, if you are at all like me, you'll look for Christ's love as an animating principle and source of unity. Indeed, just as the building will be transformed to meet the needs of our ministry, I pray that my own heart would also be likewise transfigured to better resemble Christ's!

I hope this letter finds you well during this Easter season. As we have moved into warmer spring weather, the results of last year's plantings by our Gardens and Grounds subcommittee can be seen around the parish's flowerbeds. The beautiful flowers adorning the church grounds have made for a lovely backdrop to this year's Easter service. Our G&G team was out in force during the first cleanup of this year on March 16. The beds were given new mulch, and the pots around the entrances were refreshed with new plants. The big change was the removal of the row of mostly dead bushes between the church and the playground near the north parking lot. Special thanks to Doug Crews for procuring the team a backhoe to make short work of pulling the bushes out of the ground for disposal and

helping to level out the ground after their removal. The team was also able to remove the damaged bench in the playground from the storms last year.

We've continued progressing with the Transfigure Campaign as well. The architectural drawings have all completed permitting since my last letter, and have been cleared for build. The bid package for the campaign, including the lower level, the kitchen, and the flower room, was submitted to three local general contracting companies for a quote. We've now received all three quotes back for review. None of the three contractors took any exception to the scope of work supplied by our architect! As such, we are looking to progress with Ascend Commercial Builders, a local Tulsa company that has performed several mid-size jobs in the area. As I write this article, we are currently completing a review of the contract for final signature. This will allow construction prep work to begin in April. We are very excited to move forward into this phase of the project.

This will mean starting to prepare the spaces that will be impacted by the move. We will look to store the items in the lower level, kitchen, and flower room that we intend to keep in two pods we will be bringing in for this purpose. It will also allow us to clean out our closets and rooms of items that no longer serve our ministries.

As a whole, the Transfigure project is currently projected to be on cost and schedule at this time. We hope that as we move into the demolition and construction phases, this continues to remain true. I'll work to keep you all informed of our progress as our project progresses.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Thank you to all who have submitted your 2024 Pledge to support the ongoing work and mission of Saint John's! The momentum of the current Stewardship campaign is good, but we really need each member to consider how you can step up to help Saint John's "turn the corner" on furthering our progress toward a balanced budget. If you have not pledged yet and as you consider your pledge, we think it only fair to let you know some of the considerations the Vestry must keep in mind as we plan our budget for 2024. As every household is experiencing, there are increased prices in a variety of areas. Maintenance of our historic property and utilities to keep it running continue to increase. Staff costs have likewise continued upward, with the cost of living adjustment (COLA) each year. To compensate our hard-working staff appropriately, our budget (and, thus, the Stewardship Campaign) must increase to meet demand.

Separate from the facilities and staff, the resurgence of attendance and activities at Saint John's has provided multiple new opportunities for growth and outreach in Christ. These new opportunities do often require additional resources, so the Finance Committee and Vestry appreciate your help in pledging to Saint John's. Without these gifts to "count on" it may not be possible to include these great and worthy programs and outreach events in 2024. If you have not provided your pledge or did not initially feel you could increase your previous pledge (to help Saint John's keep pace with inflation), please prayerfully consider this time-sensitive request. As others have mentioned, additional donations in the plate are wonderful (and we do budget on them coming in), but it is really critical to the sound planning of our Annual Budget to have all pledges in as soon as possible. Now is the time to trust in God and make your pledge. We thank you so much for your generosity!






BSA TROOP 153 NEWS

Troop 153 recently held our semi-annual Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops course. This is a training course for our youth troop leadership. Troop 153 is "scout led" which means we have scouts leading under the direction of adults. This leadership model builds strong leadership skills in our young men as they learn to lead others in an environment where mistakes are allowed and used as learning opportunities. The Patrol Leaders Council plans, prepares, and executes all meetings and activities with the assistance of our adult leaders as needed. In the recent training, run by youth leaders, they learned how to effectively communicate with others, plan events and activities, and successfully teach skills using the EDGE method. This core method involves 4 steps: Educate, Demonstrate, Guide, and Enable. Our older scouts teach younger scouts many basic skills, such as knot tying, first aid, and cooking, using the EDGE method.

ILST is just one of the leadership courses available to our scouts. Other training opportunities include Pine Tree, National Youth Leadership Training, and National Advanced Youth Leadership Experience. Troop 153 is proud to send many scouts to these training opportunities yearly. Not only are we sending attendees, but we also send leaders. Each of these events is scout-led, just like our troop. Scouts who excel are recruited to return as leaders. We are proud of all of our scouts and the leaders they are becoming. Thanks to our dedicated adult leadership, the future is a little brighter.
