GREETINGS, BELOVED!

In reflecting back on a wonderful September of ministry, I was especially mindful of our service of matriculation. If you missed it, we took a few minutes during an Evensong service (specially programmed with compositions by our own music staff) and "matriculated" members of our Acolytes and Choristers. We adapted this practice from my seminary alma mater, Nashotah House, which adapted its own use from Oxford University. Matriculation refers to one's enrollment into such a place, but given a liturgical setting, matriculation takes on a sense of being

being part of a community beyond one's actual involvement in a program.

We might say that when one matriculates, one is always reckoned a son or daughter of the "house."

Thus, it was a delight to formally and liturgically commission Dr. Zach Malavolti and Hank Carrillo, as well as the talented musicians they so ably lead. But reflecting on that evening, I especially treasure the experience of shaking hands with our youth and watching them sign their names to the "Rector's Book." We looked back at their signatures and relished seeing the kids' handwriting; each one of them enrolled in the ministry of the parish for the purpose of helping lead the congregation in worship in ceremony and song.

In writing their name in such a book, each one of our new ministers of Saint John's putting ink to the blank page is like planting a seed in the fertile soil. Each name enrolled represents a set of roots here at our beloved parish, roots that we pay will help our young ones grow "that they may be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, that he may be glorified." (Isaiah 61:3). Beloved, as our young ones matriculate into the rolls of our liturgical ministry, I pray that this might represent and encourage each of our enrollment into the "Lamb's book of life" (Rev. 21:27). I also pray that we are likewise encouraged to put down roots in the ministry here at Saint John's, both by nature of our work among God's people here as well as by our generous giving.

Therefore, I hope you will pay special attention during our stewardship season, which we've called "Rooted," as members of our ministry staff offer their testimony of their life and work here; how they have become rooted in the ministry of the Gospel at Saint John's and how they take seriously their call to inspire the same in our community. In heading into this new season of life at Saint John's, with wonderful changes to our physical plant and the opportunities afforded to us by God's grace abounding among his people, remember to be "rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving" (Col 2:7). I'm looking forward to a glorious autumn of ministry among you, and I covet your prayers!

I hope this letter finds you well as we firmly move into our autumn season at Saint John's.

This September we were proud to have a table at Rally Day where we received interest from 4 new members to join the committee. We look forward to expanding the committee to include these new

members during our standing October meeting.

On our Transfigure project, we've cleared up a delay in delivering our new stainless steel tables and counters. All equipment has been delivered, and our contractors are completing the installation and setup of the kitchen. We expect the kitchen to be ready for use in October. The Flower Room is following the same path as the kitchen. While behind our original schedule, the overall changes to these rooms will help the ministry groups using these facilities for years to come. We're excited to complete these major milestone completions on the project!

In the basement, we have completed the sheetrock installs to create our rooms. Tiling is beginning in the basement bathrooms now. Door frames to the conference rooms and stairwells are installed now. The hallway downwash lighting has been installed and is operational now as well. The flooring has been delivered and is ready to install as soon as the moisture barrier is applied and dried. Paint on the walls and ceilings will begin in early October. We are still on target for mid-November completion of the basement.




