Today's postlude is an arrangement of "Sine Nomine," a hymn tune almost ubiquitously set to the text "For All the Saints." John Weaver, the composer, was an American organist and pedagogue who spent much of his career teaching and concertizing. He held no less than five teaching posts during his career at some of the most prestigious organ programs in the country, including the Curtis Institute of Music and the Juilliard School. This arrangement is a jazzy setting of For all the Saints, which incorporates two other tunes: When the Saints go Marching In, and the hymn tune "Sarum," an older tune that was used to set the text of today's closing hymn. Weaver very cleverly combines all these tunes, often at the same time, giving a sense of the joy, wonder, peace, and exuberance we might feel when we are with all the Saints in Paradise.

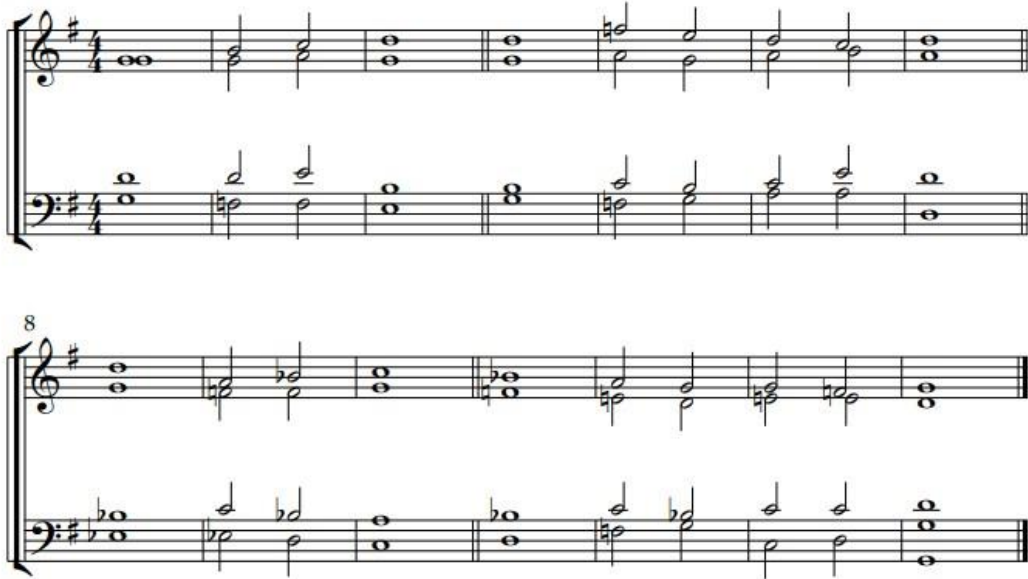


The Second Reading Revelation 21:1-6a





Presentation and Examination of the Candidate

The Celebrant says
The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Parents and Godparents
I present N. to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Celebrant
Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

Parents and Godparents
I will, with God's help.

Celebrant
Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Parents and Godparents
I will, with God's help.

Then the Celebrant asks the following questions of the parents and godparents who speak on behalf of the child.

Question Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Answer I renounce them.

Question Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Answer I renounce them.

Question Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Answer I renounce them.

Question Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

Answer I do.

Question Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Answer I do.

Question Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

Answer I do.

After the candidate has been presented, the Celebrant addresses the congregation, saying



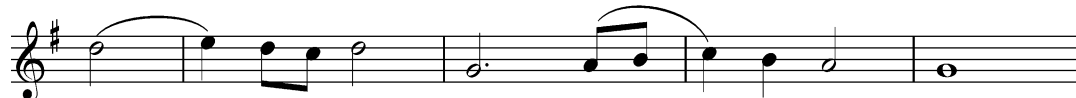
