GREETINGS, BELOVED!

In the beginning of Lent this year, I mentioned how delighted I was that people have joined with us as we've sought to broaden our devotional offerings during the season. It's been especially lovely to see more people join us at Morning and Evening Prayer, have new voices join us for Schola prayers on Thursday evenings, and even find their way to noonday devotions on Wednesdays. Among our greatest treasures, this past season was our time with Dr. Garwood Anderson, who joined us for a quiet day at the end of last month. It was, of

course, great to be with an old friend. But more than that, it was inspiring to sit at the feet of a devoted teacher of the text of the New Testament as well as a master homilist.

While Dr. Anderson's session talks were indeed deeply inspiring, I think many of us were particularly moved by his homily during our retreat Eucharist. Dr. Anderson's sermons are always laced with humor and healthy self-deprecation which combine with his deep study of the New Testament to pack quite a bit of exhortational punch. That morning's preaching was no different. He preached on the famous Parable of the Prodigal Son, the final of three similar parables in Luke 15. Dr. Anderson expertly retold the parable, adding helpful and encouraging commentary as he went. But near the end of his sermon, he helped us to reflect on the depths of God's love as Jesus taught his friends and opponents. He helped us to feel more present to the kind of divine love represented by the figure of the father in the parable, who loved both of his sons but wept on the neck of the one who returned from the "death" of dissolution and despair. Many of us were moved by Dr. Anderson's message. I certainly was.

For all the extra offerings that Lent affords, all the extra devotional opportunities that abound in a wonderful parish like ours, Dr. Anderson reminded us that all we do (Lent or otherwise) is founded on God's love poured out for us in Christ. This love moves each of us differently in task or emphasis, but yet draws into union in Jesus and unity together. This love is made most manifest in Jesus' cross and passion for us, his death and resurrection to new life. Dear ones, I pray that this coming Holy Week, you make time to join us for the week's worship so that you can experience the wonders of the Christian liturgical tradition's best enactment of the kind of love Jesus taught us in his parables, teaching, and ministry.

Finally, we have worship all throughout Holy Week, but please be especially mindful of Tenebrae on Holy Wednesday as well as the Pachal Triduum beginning on Maundy Thursday. I'll look forward to seeing you at 7:00 pm starting in Holy Wednesday and throughout the rest of the week! God bless you, and may Christ's richest blessings be with you as we conclude the forty days of Lent and look to the Great Fifty Days of Eastertide!

Children's Chapel is for PreK through 5th graders and meets on Sundays at 10 am. Join the fun - we can't wait to see you there!




PRAYERS & SQUARES
