GREETINGS, BELOVED!

It has been an extremely busy Spring at Saint John's! So many of you came to the great pilgrimage of Holy Week which gave way to the Great Day of the Resurrection on Easter Sunday. This year, Easter Sunday was cloudy and rainy which made our beautiful grounds a little too muddy for an Easter egg hunt. Thankfully, our recently transfigured lower level made for the perfect venue for this year's egg finding mission. Watching kids emerge from the stairs with baskets full of little eggs was just the sort of joyous energy I needed to finish out the last services of Easter!

In reflecting back on this year's Holy Week and Eastertide, I realized how many exciting moments of the past few weeks of ministry have included the parish children. For example, during the palm cross lesson on Palm Sunday, one of our youth started asking me very specific questions about what we know about the Church in the first and second centuries. Where did they worship? What were the early Christians like? How do we know? These are excellent questions and many books have been written across the ages to get after the answers! Sadly I did not have time to teach a seminar on the early Church (I had palm crosses to make) but I did assign the Acts of the Apostles as a great way to understand the earliest church's history as well as a google search for early Christian architecture. I'm not sure my answers on the spot fully addressed our young mind's curiosity but I was still pretty pumped that a teenager asked such superb questions about the Church's heritage.

Here's another great example. Just recently, one of our elementary schoolers was looking for something to do one morning before the 10am offering of the Holy Eucharist. Without missing a beat, Dn. Thom and David Stibbs put the young one to work as an acolyte. Wild eyed but ready to serve, it was such an absolute delight to watch this youngster learn "on the job" as we went through the course of the Sunday liturgy. It's always an honor to serve alongside the young acolytes and servers of the parish. I especially love seeing them grow in leadership skills as they progress from torch bearer to crucifer to server to thurifer. It's especially gratifying when an acolyte corrects a celebrant during a training! I've no doubt our newest liturgical servant will be helping us stay on task before too long.

It is an honor to lead a parish that takes so seriously Jesus' command to "Let the children come to me, and do not hinder them; for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven (Matthew 19:14)." As I often encourage the adults in our community here, the parish is a training ground for Christian work and holiness in the world. For our kids, this is especially true and my prayer is that we would continue to take particular joy in their formation as young saints, while as older saints we open our hearts to Christ and his Kingdom with the innocence of children. I hope your spring has gone well and that you are looking forward to some rest and relaxation this coming summer!

JR. WARDEN REPORT

Greetings to all! To say the first few weeks of my new position have been like drinking water from a fire hose would be a bit of an understatement! The extent of equipment, systems, committees, and moving parts at Saint John's is truly amazing. So, here's a couple of items we have crossed off the list:

- 1. The Grounds Committee had a workday on April 5th, cleaning out last year's growth around the grounds, renewing plants and mulch in preparation for Easter.
- 2. The issue of the stove in the kitchen "flaming out" during use has been repaired.
- 3. Start-up of the new ice machine in the kitchen is imminent with the installation of a pump to make the drain functional.
- 4. A new rolling rack for the rolls of batting in the Prayers & Squares room has been acquired and assembled and is in use.

On a larger scale, we are starting a process to deal with stormwater drainage on our entire site (curb to curb) to ensure we never have the flooding problem in the basement again (especially since it's all brand new!). This will complete the Transfigure Campaign.

And finally, we are interviewing mechanical companies to improve the preventive maintenance of our heating and air conditioning equipment. Our intent is to control our environment better and avoid any gaps in comfort as Spring moves into Summer and beyond.


PRAYERS & SQUARES


